Isaiah 6:1-4

The Inspiration of the Vision of the Lord

Isaiah 6:1-2 The Circumstances in the Vision

1 In the year of the death of King Uzziah, that I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, being high and being lifted up, and His hem filling the temple.

2 Above Him standing the seraphims. To *each* one are six wings; with two he covered his face; and with two he covered his feet; and with two he flew.

Isaiah 6:3 The Cry in the Vision

3 And this *one* cried to this *one* and said, Holy, holy, holy is Yahweh of Hosts; all the earth is full of His glory!

Isaiah 6:4 The Condition in the Vision

4 And the posts of the thresholds shook from the voice of the one who called; and the house was filled with smoke.

Isaiah 6:5-8

The Impression of the Vision upon Isaiah

Isaiah 6:5 The Confession of Isaiah

5 And I said, Woe to me! For I am ruined; for I *am* a man of unclean lips, and I am dwelling among a people of unclean lips; because my eyes have seen the King, Yahweh of Hosts.

Isaiah 6:6-7 The Cleansing of Isaiah

6 And flew one of the seraphims to me and a burning coal in his hand which he had been taken with tongs from upon the altar.

7 And he touched it upon my mouth, and said, Behold, this has touched your lips; and your iniquity is removed, and your sin is covered.

Isaiah 6:1-13

Literal English Translation

Isaiah 6:8 The Calling of Isaiah

8 And I heard the voice of Yahweh, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for Us? And I said, Behold me! Send me!

Isaiah 6:9-13

The Instruction of the Lord to Isaiah

Isaiah 6:9-10 The Commission of Isaiah

9 And He said, Go and say to this people, Hear while hearing, and do not understand; and see while seeing, and do not know it.

10 Make the heart of this people fat, and make their ears heavy, and cause their eyes to shut, that they not see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their heart, and turn back, and *one* heals him.

Isaiah 6:11-12 The Curiosity of Isaiah

11 And I said, Until when, Lord? And He said, Until which *time* the cities be ruined without inhabitant, and the houses without a man, and the land is a devastated devastation;

12 and *until* Yahweh has removed the men far away, and much is the desolation in the midst of the land.

Isaiah 6:13 The Confirmation of the Remnant

13 And yet in it will be a tenth, and *it* shall return and be burned as the terebinth tree and as the oak tree which stump is in it at the felling of them: (the holy seed *is* the stump of it).
