

<sup>10</sup> And Ezekias begat Manasses; and Manasses begat Amon; and Amon begat Josias;

<sup>11</sup> And Josias begat Jechonias and his brethren, about the time they were carried away to Babylon:

<sup>12</sup> And after they were brought to Babylon, Jechonias begat Salathiel; and Salathiel begat Zorobabel;

<sup>13</sup> And Zorobabel begat Abiud; and Abiud begat Eliakim; and Eliakim begat Azor;

<sup>14</sup> And Azor begat Sadoc; and Sadoc begat Achim; and Achim begat Eliud;

<sup>15</sup> And Eliud begat Eleazar; and Eleazar begat Matthan; and Matthan begat Jacob;

<sup>16</sup> And Jacob begat Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom was born Jesus, who is called Christ.

<sup>17</sup> So all the generations from Abraham to David *are* fourteen generations; and from David until the carrying away into Babylon *are* fourteen generations; and from the carrying away into Babylon unto Christ *are* fourteen generations.

<sup>18</sup>Now the birth of Jesus Christ was on this wise: When as his mother Mary was espoused to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Ghost.

<sup>19</sup> Then Joseph her husband, being a just *man*, and not willing to make her a publick example, was minded to put her away privily.

<sup>20</sup> But while he thought on these things, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a dream, saying, Joseph, thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Ghost.

**21 And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins.**

<sup>2</sup> Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him.

<sup>3</sup> When Herod the king had heard *these things*, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him.

<sup>4</sup> And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people together, he demanded of them where Christ should be born.

#### Introduction

Matthew Chapter Five begins the third section of the Gospel of Matthew: The Public Ministry of the Christ.

This section contains five messages, each one illustrated by a collection of healings and teachings chosen by Matthew.

Matthew Chapters 5-7 contain the first of the five messages by the Christ.  
This message is entitled The Principles of the Kingdom.

These chapters are known as the Sermon on the Mount.

Luke has a parallel account in Luke 6:20-49.

Luke's message is called the Sermon on the Plain and should be considered a different message containing the same principles as the Sermon on the Mount.

The Sermon on the Mount is a presentation of the contrast between inward and outward righteousness, or a contrast between relationship and religion.

This message is given to correct the misunderstanding and misapplication of the Old Testament Law by the Jewish religious leaders.

The Sermon on the Mount is divided into two sections.

Verses 1 and 2 contain the introduction to the Sermon on the Mount

and informs us:

of the people listening to the message;  
the place where the message was given;  
the position the Christ was in while teaching;  
and the procedure of the message.

The second section begins with Verse 3:  
the Principles of the Kingdom.



## Seven Points about Prophecy

- 1) All prophecies concerning the last days are based upon Daniel 9:24-27, which presents the 70th week of Daniel.
- 2) The 70<sup>th</sup> Week of Daniel is divided into four sections:
  - 1) Pains of birth: first 3 ½ years of the Tribulation.
  - 2) Pivotal point: the mid-point of the Tribulation.
  - 3) Perils of tribulation: the last 3 ½ years of the Great Tribulation.
  - 4) Promise of his coming: the Second Coming of Christ.
- 3) Mark 13
  - The Circumstances Surrounding the Birth Pains: verses 5-13
  - The Corruption of the Temple: verse 14
  - The Circumstances of the Tribulation: verses 15-23
  - The Coming of Christ: verses 24-27
- 4) End time prophecies are centered on the Jewish People.
- 5) Matthew took his outline of the 70th week of Daniel from Mark 13 and they both recorded the Olivet discourse.
- 6) The misunderstanding of the prophecies of the last days is based upon combining Luke's account with Matthew's and Mark's account as if they are the same message.
- 7) Luke's version includes some of the same information only given:
  - at a different time,
  - and covers different stages of the 70<sup>th</sup> Week of Daniel.
    1. Luke 21:5-6 Jesus was still in the Temple area
    2. Luke 21:7 records different questions
      - When will these things be?
      - What sign will there be when these things shall come to pass?
    3. Luke covers the first part of the pains of birth in Luke 21:8-11
      - Luke 21:12 "before all of these things"
      - Luke 21:25-28 the promise of his coming

## Seven Steps of a Jewish Wedding

- 1) The groom barter with the father of the bride.
- 2) If the bride approves of the wedding, she drinks from the Covenant Cup.
- 3) The groom goes back to his father's house to build their living quarters.
- 4) The father of the groom decides when the living quarters are done. It can take a minimum of one year and a maximum of two years. The groom can go get his bride when his father decides it is time.
- 5) When the marriage announcement is made, the people who have been invited to the wedding feast take positions along the parade route. They join the parade as it passes by.
- 6) When the groom reaches the bride's house, he stands at a distance and blows the shofar for the bride to come out to meet him. The wedding takes place at this time.
- 7) The parade goes back to the groom's house and the wedding feast begins. All of the guests in the parade gather in the Fellowship Hall and the door is shut.

Only people invited to the wedding feast can participate in the parade and only the ones who participate in the parade can enter the fellowship hall.
